NCCAOM Recertification Categories

- CO** Core Knowledge, Skill, Ability (KSA): Programs that address one of the five branches of Oriental medicine (e.g., acupuncture, Chinese herbs, Chinese dietary therapy, Qigong, Asian bodywork therapy).
- SA** Safety: Programs that address safety issues in the acupuncture and Oriental medicine and healthcare professions such as universal precautions, herbal safety, personal protective equipment (PPE's), Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), needle safety, etc.
- ET** Ethics: Programs that address ethical issues in the acupuncture and Oriental medicine and healthcare professions such as ethical decisions, liability, public health reporting, medical coding, medical billing, etc.
- AT** Adjunctive Therapies: Programs that relate to therapies that directly enhance the Diplomate's knowledge or practice in acupuncture and Oriental medicine. Examples include courses that assist the practitioner in treating the patient (e.g., cupping, electro-acupuncture, color/sound therapy, auricular acupuncture, practice management, patient education, etc.).
- BIO** Biomedicine: Western medicine and practitioner practice management.
- IT** Injection Therapy: Injection of herbs, homeopathies, and other nutritional "sterile" supplements into acupuncture points by means of hypodermic needles. The PDA Provider is required to sign an Injection Therapy Disclaimer.
- PE** Practice Enhancement (effective 2011): Programs that cover subjects outside the areas of acupuncture and Oriental medicine. Examples include yoga, crystals, Pilates, reiki, etc.
